**HERA** is an arts organization specializing in innovative and inclusive opera and music theatre. **Sky In A Small Cage** is a new Opera by Rolf Hind, with libretto by Dante Micheaux and original text by Jalal al-Din Rumi, produced by Mahogany Opera and developed in partnership with the Barbican & Copenhagen Opera Festival.

The opera is inspired by the life and works of the Sufi mystic and poet Rumi, with an exceptional cast and creative team in a dynamic mix of internationally renowned artists and rising stars. At the core of this highly original piece is the intensely emotional and spiritual love story between Rumi and his master, muse and beloved, Shams. Circling around this are episodic scenes that act as a prismatic view onto this central relationship from the world outside.

**Out Of Her Mouth** brings together three extraordinary cantatas by Élisabeth Jaquet de la Guerre, in bold new translations by Toria Banks, staged for the first time in the UK in partnership with Dunedin Consort and HERA.

Each cantata tells a story from the Old Testament, with recitative and 3 or 4 short arias. In each piece the singer, like all the best storytellers, moves between telling us a tale, and taking on the voice and perspective of the different characters: girls, women, husbands, fathers, Kings. Full of character, story and emotion, they are baroque operas but smaller, using only beguiling music and the skill of the performer to draw us in.
